Arthur Who?

It was supposed to go like this...Abaco Regatta time during early July, Green Turtle Cay, Stranded Naked, Marsh Harbor. Lot's of suds and buds!

Holly, Marialda and myself made the uneventful crossing from Port Everglades to West End, Bahamas with the usual freighter and cruise ship traffic passing us in the calm and peaceful, windless night. Sporadic radio contact during the crossing with Debbie and Stan on Ryan's Place, and then we had to wait in a long powerboat line-up at West End's marina to fuel up my gas gulping Atomic 4 Engine. We met up with Ryan's Place, who we followed with their local knowledge, through Indian Cut and then on to Mangrove Cay where we anchored the second night. The two boats combined dinner efforts and we settled



for the night. Next morning I scraped Bleu Bayou's bottom, removing a light cover of barnacles then we were on our way. Sails hoisted to Great Sale Cay and then over to Fox Town. Who knew then how well we would get to know the anchorage, the restaurant, the town and the locals?!!

Both crews dingyed to shore and had a wonderful fishy dinner (everything fried) and we wrote our names on the walls and on some burghies. We limped back to the boat and departed in the morning on the 10 mile sail to Allans-Pensacola. The wind really picked up as we tried to out-run two adult and one baby dolphin who were playing along our hull for many miles. When we approached Allans-Pensacola it was a little crowded, but manageable. The wind was picking up and more boats were coming in. Ryan's Place and Bleu Bayou were anchored near each other and since neither had radar, we tried to get some kind of weather report from the VHF radio, but had no luck.


Finally, we heard about the storm coming and threw out a second anchor. More rode was needed, though I was boxed in with all the new boats seeking refuge. Whoever heard of a Tropical Storm/Hurricane giving birth off the east coast of Florida? When we departed there was no mention of a disturbance forming and now the bands of wind and rain were directly over the northern Bahamas.

Later that evening the anchor dragged and by some luck we drifted by an anchored boat and gently came aground 20 feet from a very rocky cliff on the shoreline. Bleu Bayou's keel sitting hard in nice, white, soft sand. Stan and Debbie motored over in their dingy in the nasty wind and rain, realized we weren't going anywhere, so they promised to return in the morning.

Next morning, Stan and I nudged the stern over with our two, not so mighty, dinghies and Deb let the jib out from the helm. Bleu Bayou heeled off the sand and Stan and I had to chase her with that storm wind really moving her. The wind was so strong it broke the jib sheet block. Within minutes the sheets were wrapped and tangled high up on the forestay. We attempted to follow Ryan's Place to Green Turtle though the tangled jib and the anemic, Atomic 4 Engine would not have it. Returning to Fox Town with the storm at full strength took us a whole day of motoring at one knot and a tow into the anchorage since we were not moving forward due to directly facing into the wind at Fox Town's narrow channel. What an incredible night!!!

Alaska State Troopers called it a "hiking accident"; Foster knew it was murder. Foster focused on finding a killer.


It took 12 long years of believing someone was getting away with murder before a "DNA Hit" identified the killer. It would be another 5 years of hell before the family would realize justice.


