
The remaining prizes were handed out in the afternoon to people playing at the beach and to those that did not get a prize earlier. There were some great squirt gun wars!

#### The Perfect Club Sail includes a Rescue at Sea

On Saturday, August 13, The Grand set off for a great day at sea as an SSSF Club Sail.

Crew Chief Sheila O'Neil, lined up crew, prepared a menu, and emailed travel directions, sailing itinerary including boarding and launch times. Crew Doug Noble and Crew Gillian O'Neill, carpooled to Palm Beach Gardens.

Glancing at my phone, I saw 0959 hours, I could hear the crew walking down to *The Grand*, laughing and chatting away. Right smack dab on time, I LOVE THAT! Using a bucket brigade line we quickly put the provisions on board and stowed just as fast. *The Grand* was able to depart the dock 15 minutes early making the 1015 hours Parker Bridge opening. PERFECT!!

Winds were brisk and (of course) right on the nose blowing 18+ knots. We did a few trial tacks after entering the lake as we traveled southbound towards the Lake Worth inlet in Palm Beach.

The Grand sailed around Peanut Island at low tide dodging kayaks. Then the crew put one reef into the main sail as we entered into the Port of Palm Beach's turning basin. The inlet had big rollers which *The Grand* danced through with ease; then sailed towards the south east. Our first tack was near a small 18' to 23' outboard with a dive flag raised, stiff in the breeze. As we approached the crew noticed the small boat's operator was quite a distance from his diver's flags; he moved his boat closer after seeing us.

The Grand sailed south towards a large container ship. Rounding the ship we headed for the Palm Beach Inlet. Half way to the inlet, the VHF radio blasted "MAY DAY, U.S. Coast Guard MAY DAY"; the call was coming from a boat who's operator had lost contact with its two divers. He said he had been searching for them for 20-30 minutes before he called the Coast Guard with a MAY DAY. The boat location was transmitted to the Coast Guard and as the boat's operator reported his location



I was watching my GPS. "That's where we are," I said. We dropped and furled our sails started the motor and took out our binoculars; all eyes were on the sea looking for two dive flags. After about 15-20 minutes *The Grand* arrived near the small boat that made the MAY DAY call. Seas were about 4'- 6' but *The Grand* had the advantage of a crew with MOB training and a boat that stands 6' above the water line. Mate Doug Noble spotted two dive flags and pointed. We headed toward the flags and signaled the small boats operator indicating we could see the divers. The small boat's vision was made difficult by the high seas and he did not seem to be answering his VHF radio but recognized our yelling and pointing. He full-throttled his small boat in the pointed direction. We rounded the small outboard as the happy divers were relieved to be with their boat again. The boat's operator confirmed he radioed the coast guard with the happy news.

Entering the Palm Beach inlet 15 minutes later we met the sheriff's boat entering the sea with flashing red/blue lights. *The Grand* hailed the authorities and told them divers were safe. The sheriff continued to the small vessel.

After all the excitement, *The Grand* anchored inside the inlet, had lunch and sailed back to the dock. Perfect Club sail day! It is a day on the water, like this, that stay in your memory, without the aid of photos or Facebook. — **Captain Kelly Dobbs**
